

We will use this book to link to our farming topic and to celebrate Harvest. Children will get to bake their own bread and learn how important instructions are.




Our **Science** theme is 'Seasonal Changes' and 'Everyday Materials.'

















In **PE**, we will learn to use our hand-eye coordination to improve our ball skills within fun games. We will also explore fundamental movements such as






For **RE** this term we will be exploring the Christian Creation story. After half term we will explore what the the meaning of advent is for Christians today.
