When you get to preschool you will go to the Village Hall instead of the front playground. You will need to arrive with just your mummy or your daddy and will need to line up outside the school 2 metres apart from the person in front. One of the grown ups from Caterpillars will let you in one at a time. From here you will go into the Village Hall see all the fun activites set out ready for you. Before you start the

day you will go to the sink to give your hands a good wash.



We will be doing lots of handwashing when we get back to preschool as this is one of the best ways we can help stop any germs spreading. We will use lots of soap and warm water and then dry our hands with the



hand dryer or on a paper towel, making sure we put our paper towel in the bin afterwards. There won't be more than two children in the toilets at any time.

We won't be able to have some of the toys we normally use as we need to only use ones that can be easily cleaned.
