



Little Red Riding Hood and Baba Yaga

We will use this books books to compare and contrast traditional tales written by the same author. We will explore a story we know and discover an unknown tale. We will not hear the ending of Baba Yaga; instead we will create our own traditional tale ending. Before creating our own traditional tale.

Scott of the Antarctic

This true story is about discovering the unbelievable journey Scott and his team undertook in their race to the South Pole.

Key Learning Outcome: To write a biography of Scott of the Antarctic and to write and perform some news reports from his journey. We will be using a range of sentence starters, sentence types, a range of conjunctions and a variety of punctuation.

Science

The children will be naming and identifying polar animals. We will be observing how the seasons change as we move from Winter and into Spring watching closely how bulbs and seeds grow. We will be able to spot wild plants, deciduous and evergreen trees whilst identifying the basic structure of plants.

In RE the children will be thinking about what commitment means to us and learning about how Muslims pray 5 times a day. After half term, the children will be learning about the Christian Easter Story and the resurrection of Jesus.

The children will learn about how daily weather patterns change over time, and how weather may be different in inland/coastal areas. They will be learning about the Arctic and the Antarctic and how the weather is different there compared to the UK. They will be using globes and world maps to identify hot and cold areas.

For Chinese New Year, the children will be finding out about China, where the country is and some key physical and human features of it.

This term the children will also be learning about the world's continents and seas.

History

We will be studying and comparing two famous explorers and their adventures; Captain Scott of Antarctica and Neil Armstrong and the moon landing. We will be considering what impact these explorers had on the world today and why they were so significant at the time.

Music

The children will be learning to play the recorder, reading musical notes to know whether to play long or short notes. They will then be attempting to play simple songs.

After half term the children will be listening to and appraising a range of reggae music.

The children will continue to be be taught how to keep themselves safe online. They will hone their Powerpoint skills for a project about their favourite Arctic animal concentrating on changing font size, using italics, underlining and using bold text before saving their work and shutting down.

The more you play the game, the more it adapts and challenges the children at a personalised level for them. It will only move them on when they are extremely secure in what they have been asked to do. The Times Table Rockstars logins are stuck in the front of their reading records.

Spellings will go out each week and will be 'quizzed' in a dictation format. This is why some previous spellings from Y1 may return. We will aim to complete spelling quizzes on a Friday (New day to help with resetting new spellings). However, please make sure Spelling Books live in your child's bag so they can practice at school when given the chance.
