- Engaging with school workshops and parent teacher consultations to discuss your child's progress and attainment together with any need for further support.
- Trying to support all school activities, events and fundraisers.

## Parents' Responsibilities:

We ask for your support in achieving the high standards we expect from our pupils.

#### By:

- Ensuring your child is rested and ready for school- with a good night's sleep before school.
- Equipping them with the correct school uniform (named) together with PE kit, bookbag (or equivalent suitable school bag) and lunch which is healthy (no squash or sweets etc.).
- Sending your child punctually to start school at 8:45am every day during term time, providing they are fit and healthy.
- Contacting school as soon as possible in the case of any absence.
   This is a legal duty for parents.
- Supporting the children at home with regular reading (ideally at least four times a week), working on spellings and times tables.
