

Miss McIntyre – Preschool Following the closure of Bumblebees in August this year, Cheselbourne is very pleased to announce that we are expanding our current Caterpillar Pre-School from two days to five days a week. Also, to maximise the provision on offer for younger children in our local area, we are also changing to take children from as soon as they turn 2 years and 9 months. This is part of a longer term plan to ensure that Cheselbourne School maintains the numbers of children we have in the school and not lose younger children to other settings in other local schools. Caterpillars will be led by Miss McIntyre with support from Miss Bagwell and Miss Gatrill and under the supervision of our EYFS lead teacher, Mrs Mowlam. This will also allow opportunity for Caterpillars and Reception to join up through the day for their play-based learning.

To support this new addition to our school and support how the expertise (and workload) of our teaching staff is shared out, we are also slightly adapting how we organise the teaching across the school year groups. From September, Mrs Collett and Mrs See will be overseeing the KS1 SATS for Y2 and therefore will be teaching Y2 Maths and Literacy alongside the 12 Year 3 and 4s that we will have next year. This will also help Y2, 3 and 4 to have the calmer work (rather than EYFS/Preschool) environment, that is required for those year groups. The rest of the curriculum will be delivered in the traditional KS1/EYFS and separate KS2 split. With Mrs Mowlam with EYFS/KS1 and Mrs Collett and Mrs See with KS2.

We are also planning in opportunities for whole school mixed-age learning, where appropriate, and will be making the most of morning work, phonics and small group maths sessions where the children blend into different year group mixes and can also take part in any necessary intervention groups.

### Addition to our curriculum...



We are also really excited that from September 2019 we will be delivering Forest School sessions for all children each week. More information regarding this will come out in the first couple of weeks in September.

We are also expanding what we offer for our wrap around care from September 2019. Alongside our current Breakfast Club we will also be offering an Early Bird Drop Off from 8:30am (£1.50 per session). We are also going to be running an After School Play Club, *open every day* for all Pre-School and School children from 3:15– 4:15. This will be run by Miss McIntyre and Miss Gatrill. And be £5 per session.

Our extra-curricular clubs will also continue to run for usually around 6 week blocks each half term, but there will not be multiple options of clubs on one day anymore. They are likely to be as stated on the slide. (We are also currently looking into the possibility of one of the Sports Clubs being a Dance Club!) Booking forms for clubs from September will come out the first week back in September.
